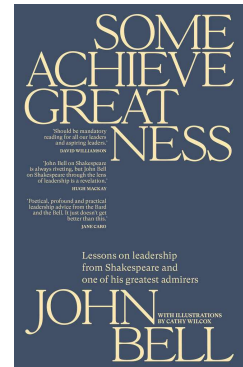


## Read: *Some Achieve Greatness*

*Some Achieve Greatness*, by John Bell, is a beautifully written book exploring the importance of turning to Shakespeare for lessons on leadership and character.

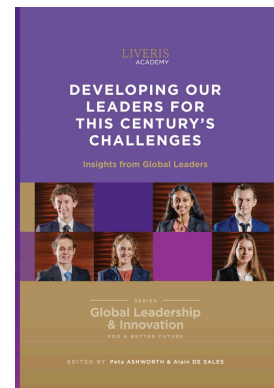
