Academy news



ACADEMY DIRECTOR, Professor Tim Kastelle

Dear Friends of the Academy,

2024 been an exciting year in the Andrew N. Liveris Academy for Innovation and Leadership. We saw our first major graduating group at the end of last year, and welcomed fifteen new scholars, keeping our overall number at around ninety-five. We have also recently welcomed our first official PhD scholarship, supported by a generous donation from Oscar and Peta-anne Groeneveld.

Having turnover like that has definitely changed the feel within the Academy. It's fantastic to see the great things that our alumni are already accomplishing out in the world, even though it's sad to see them go. At the same time, the incoming scholars have injected a great deal of new energy, passion, and knowledge into the Academy.

We are now evaluating applications for 2025 scholars! Entry remains extremely competitive, and applicant numbers have been similar to last year – we received applications from around

370 people for about 15 scholarships. It's inspiring to see the quality and enthusiasm of applicants, and how strongly the mission of the Academy resonates with them. The only downside is having to say no to so many qualified and clearly exceptional people. This is one of the reasons we continue to look for more scholarships to expand our impact.

The curriculum of activities we undertake within the Academy is an important part of achieving that impact. We've made important changes to the activities this year. First off, we've introduced a skill-building program for our first-year scholars. This includes a series of workshops on critical thinking run by Professor Deborah Brown and Dr Peter Ellerton from the UQ Critical Thinking Project. We also address learning through projects, building empathy, presentation skills, and a number of other foundational skills. Secondly, we've introduced challenge-based learning projects. These are problems that tend to be complex, poorly defined, and best approached through multi-disciplinary thinking. Everyone in the Academy has been working on a major project throughout the year, looking to develop initiatives to improve the sustainability of a major project in Brisbane. Our partner on this is still secret, but when we can tell you more about how it's gone, we will!

Engaging with people, organisations, and businesses is an important part of helping the scholars develop the capabilities they need to achieve our mission. If you are interested in working with the Academy in any way, would like to learn more about ways to sponsor scholarships, mentoring scholars, or offering internships to these wonderful individuals, please do not hesitate to reach out to me.
